2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §606, sub-§8** is enacted to read:

6 8. No maximum limit on price. An agency store may sell
8 liquor at any price equal to or higher than the retail sales
10 price set in accordance with chapters 65 and 67.

12 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

14 This bill permits agency liquor stores to sell liquor at a
16 price higher than the price set by the State for liquor sold at
18 state liquor stores. Currently, rules of the State Liquor and
Lottery Commission require agency liquor stores to sell liquor at
the same price as do state liquor stores.
