Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 1 MRSA §1016-D is enacted to read:

§1016-D. Disclosure of allowance for constituent services

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Each Legislator shall file a statement on the allowance for
constituent services received pursuant to Title 3, section 2 to
the commission by 5:00 p.m. on December 1st of each year on a
form provided by the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State
shall deliver the necessary form to each member of the Senate and
the House of Representatives prior to the end of the last week in
October of each year. The statement must include an itemized
list of all expenditures from the allowance and is considered a
public record.

Sec. 2. 3 MRSA §2, 3rd ¶, as amended by PL 1989, c. 878, Pt. D, \S 14 and 15, is further amended to read:

2.0 Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives shall be entitled to a meal allowance in the amount of \$32 and a housing allowance in the amount of \$38 for each day in attendance 22 at sessions of the Legislature and for each day the member 24 occupies overnight accommodations away from home either immediately preceding or immediately following attendance at daily sessions of the Legislature. In lieu of the meal and 2.6 housing allowance, each member shall-be is entitled to a daily meal allowance in the amount of \$32 and actual daily mileage 28 allowances allowance in an amount up to but not exceeding \$38 per day. Each member of the Senate shall-also is entitled to receive 30 an annual allowance for constituent services in the amount of 3.2 \$1,000, \$650 of which shall must be received at the start of each regular session and \$350 of which shall must be received in the month following adjournment of the regular session. Each member 34 of the House of Representatives shall-also is entitled to receive an annual allowance for constituent services in the amount of 3.6 \$750, \$500 of which shall must be received at the start of each 38 regular session and \$250 of which shall must be received in the month following adjournment of the regular session. An allowance 40 for constituent services that has not been expended by the end of the legislative term must be returned to the Legislative 42 Council. All expenditures of the allowance for constituent services are subject to Title 1, section 1016-D.

STATEMENT OF FACT

48 This bill requires a Legislator to account for and provide an itemized list of expenditures from the allowance for 50 constituent services. The bill also requires that a Legislator return any unexpended amount to the Legislative Council.

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
