- 2 Sec. 1. 24-A MRSA §4236, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 669, §6, is amended to read: The health maintenance organization shall Benefits. 6 provide benefits covering care by chiropractic providers at least equal to and consistent with the benefits paid to other health 8 care providers treating similar neuro-musculoskeletal conditions, including but not limited to the following benefits. 10 1.2 A. An enrollee may utilize the services of a chiropractic provider for 4 weeks of treatment without the prior approval 14 of a primary care provider or the health maintenance organization. 16 B. Within 3 days of the first consultation, the chiropractic provider shall send to the primary care 1.8 provider a report containing the enrollee's complaint, related history, examination, initial diagnosis and treatment plan. 2.2 C. If the enrollee and the chiropractic provider determine that the condition of the enrollee has not improved after 4 24 weeks of treatment, the chiropractic provider shall discontinue treatment and refer the enrollee to the primary 26 care provider. 2.8 D. If the chiropractic provider recommends treatment beyond 4 weeks, the chiropractic provider shall send to the primary 30 care provider a 4-week report containing information on the 32 enrollee's progress and treatment plan. E. After receiving the 4-week report from the chiropractic 34 provider, the primary care provider may request a review by another chiropractic provider who is licensed and practices 36 within the State and who is chosen by the primary care 2.9provider. A recommendation of up to 4 more weeks of
 - F. After 8 weeks of chiropractic treatment, continuing chiropractic treatment requires the agreement of the primary care provider.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill allows enrollees in health maintenance organizations to refer themselves to chiropractic providers for 4 weeks of treatment. It allows more treatment under certain conditions. Chiropractic treatment beyond 8 weeks requires the agreement of the primary care provider.
