An Act to Provide for an Appeals Process for Teacher Certification.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13011, sub-§7, as enacted by PL 1993, c. Δ 200, $\S1$, is amended to read: Certification waiver. Under rules adopted by the state 6 7. board, the commissioner may grant a waiver for an appropriate R period of time to an individual seeking the issuance or renewal of a certificate. The commissioner may grant a waiver to an individual who: 10 12 Α. Receives allegedly inaccurate, incomplete or untimely information or action from the department or its agents, the 14 local support system or a regional support system; er 16 Demonstrates compliance with certification requirements Β. by some means not anticipated in the certification rules. : 1.8or C. Has failed to attain the minimum score on the teacher 20 qualifying exams under section 13035 and demonstrates that the failure is due to the existence of a learning disability. 2.2 An individual who is denied the issuance or renewal of a 24 certificate for reasons outlined in paragraphs A, and B or C may apply for a waiver to an appeals committee selected by the state 26 board. The appeals committee must consist of 4 permanent members who serve for terms of 3 years, including one school 28 administrator, one teacher or educational specialist, one faculty 30 member from a teacher education program approved by the state board and one public member who is not, and never has been, a professional educator. For each case considered by the appeals 3.2 committee, the state board shall select a 5th appeals committee 34 member representing the professional specialty organization in the discipline or level under review. 36 The appeals committee shall review the application for a waiver and make a recommendation to the commissioner. Following a 3.8 review of the application and recommendation, the commissioner shall make a final decision and provide a written justification 40 for the decision. 42 The state board and the commissioner shall test and evaluate this certification waiver process and report their findings to the 44 joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over educational matters on or before January 1, 1995 1996. 46 48

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill adds an additional category to the existing grounds upon which the Commissioner of Education, following review by an appeals committee, may waive teacher certification standards. The bill permits a waiver from the requirement that a teacher must pass the teacher qualifying examination in order to be certified if the teacher demonstrates that the failure to pass is caused by the existence of a learning disability.

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
