Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

#### 'FISCAL NOTE

This bill establishes a new Class C crime. Sentences of more than 12 months imposed for Class C crimes must be served in a state correctional institution. The cest to the State per sentence is \$48,584 based upon an average length of stay of one year and 9 months. The State also must reimburse counties for sentences served in county jails of 12 months or less for Class C crimes.

This bill increases a Class E crime to a Class D crime. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties are estimated to be \$83.22 per day for each offender. These costs are not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

The Judicial Department may require additional General Fund appropriations to cover indigent defense costs related to these new cases. The amounts can not be estimated at this time. The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.

The additional costs to suspend commercial operating licenses of drivers with 3 or more violations of specified federal regulations can be absorbed by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles within the Department of the Secretary of State utilizing existing budgeted resources. The collection of additional reinstatement fees will increase Highway Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This is a minority report. This amendment rewrites the manslaughter provision governing truck drivers and their supervisors. It creates a Class C crime of manslaughter for operators or supervisors of operators who intentionally or knowingly violate a federal regulation governing hours of service and record keeping, and that violation in fact causes a person's death.

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## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

### COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " $\mathcal{B}$ " to H.P. 292, L.D. 396

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This amendment deletes sections 3 and 4 of the bill.

This amendment revises section 6 of the bill to delete the provisions concerning impoundment of vehicles. It instead requires the Secretary of State to suspend the commercial operating license of a driver who has 3 or more violations of the hours of service or record-keeping regulations within a 12-month period. The suspension must be for at least 30 days.
