Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 19 MRSA §766, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1985, c. 495, §14, is further amended to read:

2. Duration. Any protective order or approved consent agreement shall-be is for a-fixed an indefinite period net-te exceed-one-year. At-the expiration-of-that-time, the court-may extend--an-order, --upon--metion--of-the--plaintiff, --for--such additional-time-as-it-deems necessary to protect-the-plaintiff-or miner-child-from-abuse. Upon motion by a party, the court may terminate the order or agreement if both parties agree. Upon motion by either party, for sufficient cause, the court may modify the order or agreement from time to time as circumstances require.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill changes the duration of a protection from abuse order or approved consent agreement from a one-year limit to an indefinite period of time. It allows the order to be terminated upon motion by one of the parties, if both parties agree.
