## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 14 MRSA §8107, as amended by PL 1991, c. 460, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read: 4 6 This section does not apply when the governmental entity that is the subject of the claim has procured insurance against 8 liability for a claim against that entity or its employees under this chapter and the insurance carrier or its agent is in contact 10 with the claimant or the claimant's representative within the 180-day notice period. 12 14 STATEMENT OF FACT 16 This bill waives the notice requirements of the Maine Tort 18 Claims Act in cases when the insurance carrier for the governmental entity is in contact with the claimant or the 20 claimant's representative during the 180-day notice period. This recognizes that, in those cases, the purpose of the notice requirement of putting the governmental entity on notice 22 concerning the claim has been satisfied. 24
