2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7406, sub-§21** is enacted to read:

6 **21. Allowing a junior hunter to hunt without adult**
8 **supervision. A person is guilty of allowing a junior hunter to**
10 **hunt without adult supervision if that person, who is the adult**
12 **supervisor, parent or guardian of a holder of a junior hunting**
14 **license under the age of 16, allows that junior hunter to hunt**
16 **other than in the presence of, and under the supervision of, an**
18 **adult.**

14 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

16 This bill requires that a holder of a resident junior
18 hunting license, who is between the ages of 10 and 15, must hunt
in the presence of and under the supervision of an adult.
