SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 166, L.D. 427, Bill, "An Act to Create an Intermediate License for Minors"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 1 the following:

'Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA §1251, sub-§6, ¶A, as amended by PL 1995, c. 65, Pt. A, §99 and affected by Pt. A, §153 and Pt. C, §15, is further amended to read:

A. A nonresident who is 16 years of age or older and who has in that person's possession a valid license or instruction permit issued by that person's state or province. A nonresident operator shall adhere to all restrictions applied to the license or instruction permit issued by that person's state or province. A nonresident who is not yet 16 years of age may not operate a motor vehicle. A nonresident who is not yet 17 years of age may not operate a motor vehicle on a public way between the hours of midnight and 5:00 a.m.

This paragraph may be enforced only if a law enforcement officer has detained the operator of a motor vehicle for a suspected violation of another law;'

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment prohibits a 16-year-old with a nonresident license from operating a motor vehicle between the hours of midnight and 5 a.m. It adds a provision allowing enforcement of the prohibition of a 16-year-old with a nonresident license from
