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30	Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated " <u>§170-A.</u> " by striking out the first indented paragraph (lines 17 to 20 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:
32	'Legislative employees are prohibited from at any time using
34	the computer system, telephones, copying machines and other legislative equipment for work related to campaigns.'
36	Further amend the bill in section 1 by striking out all of
38	that part designated " §170-B. " (lines 22 to 26 in L.D.).
40	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:
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44	'FISCAL NOTE
46	The Legislature may realize General Fund salary savings if partisan employees take leaves of absence to pursue campaign
