An Act Requiring That Disbursement Warrants Receive an Affirmative Vote by Municipal Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §5603, sub-§2, ¶A, as amended by PL 1993, c. 96, $\S2$, is further amended to read: 4 6 Α. Except as provided in subparagraphs (1) and (2), disburse money only on the authority of a warrant drawn for the purpose, affirmatively voted and signed by a majority of 8 the municipal officers. 10 (1)The municipal officers may adopt a written policy to permit the disbursement of employees' wages and 12 benefits when a disbursement warrant has been signed by 14 one or more designated municipal officers. The policy must be filed with the town clerk and the municipal treasurer and renewed annually by vote of the municipal 16 officers. 18 The municipal officers may adopt a written policy (2) 20 to permit the disbursement of payments for municipal education costs when a disbursement warrant has been 22 signed by the school superintendent and approved by a majority of the school board or by a finance committee 24 appointed or duly elected by the school board. The policy must be filed with the town clerk and the municipal treasurer and renewed annually by vote of the 26 municipal officers; 28 30 STATEMENT OF FACT 32 This bill requires a formal affirmative vote of the majority of the municipal officers before a municipal treasurer can 34 disburse money.
