Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Saco River Corridor Commission performs a critical role in protecting the drinking water quality of the rivers within the Saco River Corridor and should continue to do so; and

10 Whereas, the Saco River Corridor Commission is in the process of identifying sources of revenue sufficient to continue 12 to fulfill its mandate; and

14 Whereas, the Saco River Corridor Commission may cease to operate unless a new source of partial funding is provided; and

Whereas, the Biddeford and Saco Water Company recognizes the importance of clean water from rivers within the Saco River Corridor for its customers; and

- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §969 is enacted to read:

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<u>§969. Saco River Corridor Fund</u>

Fund established. The Saco River Corridor Fund is
 established as a private, interest-bearing account. All charges collected pursuant to this section must be deposited into the fund. All interest earned by the account becomes part of the fund. Any balance remaining in the fund at the end of the fiscal
 year does not lapse but is carried forward into subsequent fiscal years. Revenue to the fund is collected, managed, deposited, invested and disbursed in a manner that is independent of control by the Department of Administrative and Financial Services.

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2. Fund purpose. The purpose of the Saco River Corridor
 44 Fund is to preserve existing water quality and prevent the deterioration of water supplies in the Saco River, the Ossipee
 46 River and the Little Ossipee River within the Saco River Corridor, as defined by section 953, by partially underwriting
 48 the administration and operation of the Saco River Corridor Commission, as established by Title 5, section 12004-G,
 50 subsection 13.

2	3. Collection and disposition of fees. The Biddeford and
	Saco Water Company, established in Private and Special Law 1881,
4	chapter 124, section 1, may assess and collect a fee on its
	residential customers equal to 1% of the amount charged for the
6	sale or distribution of water for drinking or for fire protection
	services. The fee may be levied as a percentage increase on the
8	rates of the Biddeford and Saco Water Company. The total amount
	assessed and collected pursuant to this section may not exceed
10	\$25,000 per 12-month period. The Biddeford and Saco Water
	Company shall suspend or adjust assessment and collection of the
12	fee as necessary to ensure that the total amount assessed and
10	collected per 12-month period does not exceed \$25,000. The fee
14	may not be levied on commercial or industrial customers.
7.4	may not be review on commercial of induscrial cuscomers.
16	Any fees collected under this section must be remitted at least
10	quarterly by the Biddeford and Saco Water Company to the Saco
18	River Corridor Commission. The Biddeford and Saco Water Company
20	may retain a portion of the total fees collected equivalent to
20	the company's administrative costs incurred in the collection and
20	remission of the fees, not to exceed 2% of the total fees
22	collected. For purposes of the Public Utilities Commission's
22	rate-making authority, costs actually incurred by the Biddeford
24	and Saco Water Company associated with the collection and
21	remission of the fees for the Saco River Corridor Fund are deemed
26	just and reasonable for rate-making purposes. The Saco River
20	Corridor Commission shall adopt any rules that are reasonably
28	necessary to carry out the purposes of this section pursuant to

sufficient sources of additional revenue have not been put into place by that date, the committee shall propose legislation that
repeals the Saco River Corridor Fund.

48 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

2	STATEMENT OF FACT
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	This bill establishes the Saco River Corridor Fund in order

	whether additional sources of funding to support the Saco River
10	Corridor Commission have been put into place.
