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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill postpones the implementation and opening of the Maine School of Science and Mathematics. It applies retroactively to February 15, 1995, which is the date by which a plan must be submitted to the Legislature that outlines the statewide education programs that would assist in the professional development of the school.
