_	Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §1661-D is enacted to read:
4	§1661-D. Latch-open gas pumps
6	A full-service gasoline station offering self-service
8	pumping at a lower cost and a gasoline station offering only
10	self-service pumping shall make available for automobiles and shall identify clearly at least one pump with an automatic
12	closing hose nozzle valve with a latch-open device approved by the State Fire Marshal.

16	STATEMENT OF FACT
18	This bill requires that gas stations with only self-service pumping or with self-service pumping at a lower price than
20	full-service must have at least one pump with a latch-open device. This is a device that allows the person pumping the gas
22	to latch the pump open so that it is unnecessary to manually hold

it open.
