§7557. Petition for opening a pond to fishing

Notwithstanding Title 5, section 8055, whenever the commissioner receives a petition to open any pond to fishing and the petition is signed by 25 or more registered voters, the department shall initiate rule-making proceedings to open the pond to fishing within 60 days after receipt of the petition. The petition must be verified and certified in the same manner provided in Title 21-A, section 354, subsection 7 prior to its presentation to the commissioner.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to initiate rule-making proceedings when it receives a certified petition from 25 or more registered voters requesting that a pond be opened to fishing. Currently, under the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, an agency must initiate rule-making proceedings within 60 days of receiving a petition signed by 150 registered voters.
