An Act to Require That Headlights Be on during Inclement Weather.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2067, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read: 4 6 1. Display of lights. A vehicle located on a way must be equipped with lights as described in section 1904. The lights must be illuminated during the period 1/2 hour after sunset to 8 1/2 hour before sunrise and at-any-time-when,-due-to-insufficient 10 light--or <u>during</u> unfavorable atmospheric conditions, including, but not limited to, rain, freezing rain, fog or snow,-persens-er vehieles-on-the-way-are-not-discernible-for-a-distance-of-1,000 12 feet-ahead. This section does not apply to a vehicle that is 14 parked or standing off the main traveled portion of the way. 16 STATEMENT OF FACT 18 This bill requires headlights to be on during inclement
