### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 23 MRSA \$1913-A, sub-\$1,  $\PH$ , as enacted by PL 1981, c. 318, \$3, is amended to read:

H. Signs bearing political messages relating to an election, primary or referendum, previded except that these signs may not be placed within the right-of-way prior to 6 weeks before the election, primary or referendum to which they relate and must be removed by the candidate or political committee not later than one week thereafter after the election. Signs bearing political messages relating to an election, primary or referendum may not be placed within 100 feet of an intersection as defined by Title 29-A, section 101, subsection 29.

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits the placement of political campaign signs within 100 feet of any intersection.
