Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

8 1. Statement of policy. The Legislature declares that it is the policy of the State that cooperation among Maine libraries 10 of all types should be fostered and encouraged. The sharing of library holdings and of library-developed tools for obtaining 12 electronic information from networked resources enriches the economic, educational and cultural life of each Maine community. 14 Citizen access to materials purchased with public dollars in an era of widespread access to electronic information networks requires that materials be identifiable by title and physical 16 It is in the public interest that the Maine State location. 18 Library promote and assist access by recording the-holdings-of Maine--libraries--in--a--form--accessible--by--modern--information 20 technology information about resources available through Maine libraries and maintaining them in a always-current, immediately 22 accessible electronic form readily available to every citizen through a variety of telephone and network connections. In-this 24 way -- the - educational -- and -- informational - resources -- of - the -- State will-be-available-te-every-eitigen.

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2. Legislative intent. Recognizing the value of broad library--materials -- and -- recognizing -- that 28 citizen access to automated--records--are--essential--to--the--uso--of--technology information, the State assigns to the Maine State Library the 30 responsibility of eellecting-the-holding-records-ef-libraries 32 throughout-Maine-and-making-them-accessible-in-machine-readable £0£m providing electronic access to information resources including: the creation of an online catalog of the holdings of 34 libraries and other governmental units throughout the State; the 36 provision of online indexing, full text and document delivery of newspaper, periodical and journal articles; the maintenance of a 38 gateway to the Internet and its vast array of electronic resources: the coordination of an effective and efficient means 40 of transporting physical materials among libraries; and the development of a program to teach citizens of the State to successfully locate, retrieve and use the information contained 42 within various computer systems. It-is-the-State's-intent-that 44 these-records-be-shared-with-any-citizen-er-library-on-request. It is the intent of the Legislature to provide the Maine State 46 Library with the resources necessary to carry out this section.
