Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA \$12705, sub-\$1, as amended by PL 1993, c. 111, \$1, is further amended to read:

- 1. Membership. The board of trustees consists of 13 appointed voting members and -3-ex--efficier-voting-members as follows:
- 10 C. Twelve <u>graduates of the Maine Technical College System</u>
 who are from the field of business and industry, the field
 12 of labor, the field of education and the general public; <u>and</u>
- 14 D---The Commissioner of Education, -- or the commissioner's successor, -who-serves-ex-officie;
- E---The-Gommissioner-of-Economic-and-Gommunity-Development, or-the-commissioner's-successor,-who-serves-ex-officio;
- Fr---The--Commissioner---of--Laber,---or---the--commissioner's successor,-who-serves-ex-officio;-and
 - G. One member who is from the student body of one of the technical college campuses at the time of appointment and who is a permanent resident of the State. To be eligible for appointment as a student member, a student must be enrolled for a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester.

The student member is a full voting member of the board of trustees and serves for a 2-year term and until a successor By January 1st of every 2nd year, the is qualified. president of the system shall solicit a list of 5 eliqible students from the student governments from 5 of the campuses within the Maine Technical College System, the 6th campus being excluded in accordance with this subsection. Governor shall then nominate a student trustee chosen from the list within 30 days of receiving the list of names. nomination is subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters and to confirmation by the Legislature. The student trustee may not come from the same campus in any 2 consecutive terms. In the event that the student trustee transfers from one campus to another during the student's term of appointment, the student's original campus of enrollment is the campus excluded when the next student trustee is appointed.

Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §12710, as amended by PL 1989, c. 443, §46, is further amended to read:

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§12710. Maine Technical College System Office

The Maine Technical College System Office shall implement the policies of the board of trustees and shall provide staff-and technical-assistance to-each-college-and state-level coordination and leadership to the system. Expenditures for the system office may not exceed 2% of the State's appropriation to the system.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill changes the composition of the Board of Trustees of the Maine Technical College System by requiring certain members to be graduates of the Maine Technical College System and by eliminating 3 ex officio commissioner members. The bill also repeals the requirement that the Maine Technical College System Office provide staff and technical assistance to each college and requires that expenditures for the system office not exceed 2% of the State's appropriation to the system.
