#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §3203, as amended by PL 1979, c. 127, §124, 4 is further amended to read:

#### 6 §3203. Sunday sales of motor vehicles limited

8 Any person who shall--carry-on-or-engage engages in the business of buying, selling, exchanging, dealing or trading in new or used motor vehicles; or who shall-open opens any place of 10 business or lot wherein-he where that person attempts to or does engage in the business of buying, selling, exchanging, dealing or 12 trading in new or used motor vehicles; or who does buy, sell, exchange, deal or trade in new or used motor vehicles as a 14business on the first day of the week, commonly known and 16 designated as Sunday, is a disorderly person. Such a disorderly person upon conviction for the first offense shall-be-punished-by is subject to a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for 18 not more than 10 days, or by both +, and for the 2nd offense shall be-punished-by is subject to a fine of not more than \$500 or by 20 imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both $_{1}$  and for the 22 3rd or each subsequent offense shall-be-punished-by is subject to a fine of not more than \$750 or by imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or by both. If the person is the holder of dealer or 24 transporter registration plates under Title--29,--ehapter--5, subehapter-III-A Title 29-A, chapter 9, such that person shall-be 26 is subject to the suspension or revocation of said those plates, as provided for in Title 29 29-A, section 350-A, 903, subsection 28 1, paragraph H, for the violation of this section.

A person otherwise subject to this section who operates a motor vehicle dealership in which the operation, including service garage, office and indoor and outdoor sales space, does not exceed 20,000 square feet and who regularly closes that dealership on a day other than Sunday because of religious belief may operate that business on Sunday.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill allows motor vehicle dealerships that are under 20,000 square feet to remain open on Sunday provided the dealership regularly closes on a day other than Sunday because of the religious beliefs of the dealer.
