24	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting
26	clause and before the statemen t of fact and inserting in its place the following:

42	Land use standards adopted pursuant to this chapter for
44	management districts shall may in no way limit the right, method
46	or manner of cutting or removing timber or crops, the construction and maintenance of hauling roads, the operation of
48	machinery or the erection of buildings and other structures used primarily for agricultural or commercial forest product purposes,
	including tree farms. Notwithstanding this subsection, a permit
50	from the commission shall-be is required for roads covering a

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ground area of 3 acres or more constructed in management
districts, unless those roads are constructed and maintained in accordance with the guidelines of the commission's Land Use
Handbook, Section 6, "Erosion Control on Logging Jobs," or as revised. The commission may require a person constructing a road
to notify the commission of the location of the road within 21 days.

In adopting district boundaries and land use standards, the commission shall give consideration to public and private planning reports and other data available to it, and shall give weight to existing uses of land and to any reasonable plan of its owner as to its future use.

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A permit from the commission is not required for the repair or 16 maintenance of county-owned roads, bridges or culverts as long as the repair or maintenance is conducted in accordance with 18 commission standards that pertain to these activities.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment replaces the original bill. It provides that a permit is not required from the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission for the repair or maintenance of county-owned roads, bridges or culverts as long as the repair or maintenance is conducted in accordance with applicable commission standards.

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
