An Act to Require the Department of Human Services to Pay for Testing Public School Water Supplies in Accordance with the Safe Drinking Water Act.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2660-B, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 410, Pt. DD,  $\S4$ , is amended to read: 4 6 5. Noncommunity water system. "Noncommunity water system" means a public water system that is not a community water system and is not a public school. A noncommunity water system is 8 either nontransient or transient, as follows. 10 Α. A nontransient, noncommunity water system serves at 12 least 25 of the same persons for 6 months or more per year and may include, but is not limited to, a sekeel, factory, 14 industrial park or office building. 16 B. A transient, noncommunity water system serves at least 25 persons, but not necessarily the same persons, for at least 60 days per year and may include, but is not limited to, a 18 highway rest stop, seasonal restaurant, seasonal motel, golf 20 course, park or campground. A bottled water company is a transient, noncommunity water system. 22 Sec. 2. Appropriation.
