	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
4	Whereas, the Task Force on the Maine School of Visual and
6	Performing Arts was established by Public Law 1993, chapter 706 and its members have already begun performing their duties; and
8	Whereas, this bill proposes to increase the membership on
10	the task force and makes a change affecting the development of a plan to implement a school for the visual and performing arts; and
12	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts

2628	Part as the "task force," is established to develop a plan to implement a school for the arts in the greater Portland area or greater Bangor areas to open in September of 1996.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill increases the membership of the Task Force on the
Maine School of Visual and Performing Arts enacted by Public Law
1993, chapter 706. This bill provides for the appointment of
members from the greater Bangor area and includes the greater
Bangor area as a potential site for the school for the arts.
