Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §953, 2nd ¶, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 459, §1, is amended to read:

The corridor shall-also-include includes the lands adjacent to these rivers to a distance of 500 150 feet as measured on a horizontal plane from the normal or mean high water line of these rivers er-to-the-edge-of-the-100-year-floodplain-if-that-extends beyond-500-feet,-up-to-a-maximum-of-1,000-feet. A municipality may extend that portion of the corridor within municipal boundaries to a total of 250 feet as measured on a horizontal plane from the normal or mean high water line of these rivers.

This bill reduces the width of the Saco River Corridor to 150 feet and provides a municipality the option to extend that part of the corridor within the municipality's boundaries an additional 100 feet.
