22	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the emergency clause and inserting in its place
24	the following:
26	'Sec.1. 5 MRSA §13090-B, sub-§4 is enacted to read:
28	4. Local and regional organizations. Notwithstanding other provisions of this section, for fiscal years 1994-95 and 1995-96
30	the department, upon application, may provide grants to local and regional nonprofit organizations up to a total amount of \$200,000
32	for the 2 years combined. Funds may be loaned to a private business entity or expended in a manner that is approved by the
34	department and offers the prospect of stimulating economic growth. This subsection is repealed July 1, 1996.'

Development to use a portion of the program's dedicated revenue funds to match federal grants designated for economic conversion activities. The necessary allocations have been included in Public Law 1995, chapter 5.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

The original bill extends the grant-making capacity of the 10 Department of Economic and Community Development under the Economic Opportunity Program, currently limited to 12 municipalities, to local and regional nonprofit organizations.

14 This amendment limits the expansion to the fiscal years 1994-95 and 1995-96 and limits the total amount that may be 16 granted to these organizations to \$200,000.
