- Commission created; study. Resolved: Sec. 1. Commission to Study the Use of Wooden and Wire Lobster Traps, 2 referred to in this resolve as the "commission." is created. President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall jointly appoint 10 persons to study the use 6 of wooden and wire lobster traps in state coastal waters. Appointments must include at least one person representing each 8 lobster association in the State, at. least. one person representing the manufacturers of wooden lobster traps, at least 10 one person representing manufacturers of wire lobster traps and at least one person representing the Department of Marine 12 Resources. Other members must be persons who participate in the harvesting and sale of lobsters or persons who demonstrated interest in the biological or economic issues 14 associated with the use of wooden or wire lobster traps; and be it further 16
- Sec. 2. Appointments. Resolved: That all appointments must be made not later than 30 days after the effective date of this resolve; and be it further
- Sec. 3. Reporting date. Resolved: That the commission shall report its findings to the Legislature by December 15, 1995; and be it further
 - Sec. 4. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission serve without compensation.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve establishes the 10-person Commission to Study the Use of Wooden and Wire Lobster Traps. The membership of the study group must include manufacturers of wooden and wire lobster traps, a representative of the Department of Marine Resources, members of organized lobster associations throughout the State and others interested in the biological and economic issues associated with the use of wooden and wire lobster traps. The commission must report its findings to the Legislature by December 15, 1995.
