An Act to Modify the Motor Vehicle Emission Inspection Requirement for Vehicle Registration.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, current law requires that citizens of Maine present either a certificate of compliance or a certificate of waiver issued under the motor vehicle emission inspection program in order to register a motor vehicle; and

Whereas, the United States Environmental Protection Agency 10 has advised the State that the agency is changing 12 interpretations of the requirements for state compliance with the Clean Air Act, including what elements will be necessary for an acceptable inspection and maintenance program; and 14

Whereas, it would be an unfair burden upon the State and its citizens to require presentation of these compliance and waiver certificates for the brief time period from March 1st to May 1st if the United States Environmental Protection Agency significantly changes its interpretation of the inspection and maintenance program; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §403, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:

- 1. Requirement. The After May 1, 1995, the owner of a motor vehicle registered in any area designated by the Federal Government pursuant to 40 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 81 as nonattainment for ozone and classified as a moderate or a more severe nonattainment area must present a certificate of compliance or waiver, as defined by Title 38, section 2401, at the time of registration. A certificate of compliance or waiver is not required for motor vehicles exempted by Title 38, section 2402.
  - Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

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### **FISCAL NOTE**

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Deferring the vehicle registration enforcement requirement under the motor vehicle emission testing program will reduce dedicated revenue collected by the Department of Environmental Protection and the Secretary of State. The amounts can not be estimated at this time.

The deferral of this enforcement provision under the motor vehicle testing program may result in the contractor bringing suit against the State for monetary losses incurred as a result of the deferral. If the plaintiff is successful, a General Fund appropriation for the recovery will be necessary. The amount and timing of the appropriation will depend on when the suit is filed and its outcome.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill defers the vehicle registration requirement that a citizen present a certificate of compliance or waiver under the motor vehicle emission inspection program in order to allow time for the United States Environmental Protection Agency to clarify the requirements for state compliance with the Clean Air Act, including the inspection and maintenance program.
