An Act Concerning Licensing of Clinical Counselors.

Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, current law governing the licensing of counselors "grandfathers" persons who were practicing counseling prior to January 1, 1991; and

Whereas, this Act repeals that provision, effective June 30, 10 1995; and

12 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 14 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 16 safety; now, therefore,

18 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

20 Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §13851, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 465, §3, is amended to read:

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 Clinical counselor. "Clinical prefessional counselor"
means a professional counselor who renders or offers to render for a fee, monetary or otherwise, to individuals, families, groups, organizations or the general public, a counseling service involving the application of the principles and procedures of counseling to assess and treat intrapersonal and interpersonal problems and other dysfunctional behaviors and to assist in the overall development and adjustment of those served.

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Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §13852, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1991, c. 263, §2, is further amended to read:

The board consists of 13 members, 12 of them 2. Members. appointed by the Governor. Each member must be a citizen of the 36 United States and a resident of this State. Eight members must 38 be licensed counseling professionals under this chapter, 2 of whom must be professional counselors, 2 must be clinical 40 professional counselors, 2 must be marriage and family therapists and 2 must be pastoral counselors. Two members must be registered counseling professionals who are not qualified for 42 Each counselor member must have been, for at least 5 licensure. years immediately preceding appointment, actively engaged as a 44 practitioner, educator or researcher. Two members must be representatives of the general public and may not be currently 46 practicing counseling or receiving compensation for counseling 48 services. One of the 2 public members must be a consumer of counseling services. One member, appointed by the Chancellor of the University of Maine System, must be a member of the university faculty involved in the training of counselors.

Sec. 3. 32 MRSA 13854, sub-1, as amended by PL 1989, c. 895, 7, is further amended to read:

Licensing. Effective October 1, 1992, no person may,
unless specifically exempted by this chapter, profess to be a clinical prefessional counselor, professional counselor, marriage
and family therapist, licensed pastoral counselor or conditional license holder unless licensed in accordance with this chapter.

Sec. 4. 32 MRSA §13855, as affected by PL 1991, c. 263, §§5 14 and 6, is amended to read:

16 §13855. Psychological testing; assessment services

18 Nothing in this chapter may be construed as permitting clinical professional counselors, professional counselors, 20 marriage and family therapists, pastoral counselors or conditional license holders to hold themselves out to the public as psychologists or psychological examiners as defined in section 2.2 3811, subsection 1, or to offer primarily or solely the services 24 of psychological testing. The board shall adopt ethical standards relating to the utilization of assessment techniques.

Sec. 5. 32 MRSA §13858, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 465, \$3, is amended to read:

30 2. Licensed clinical counselor. To be qualified as a licensed clinical prefessional counselor, an applicant shall must
32 have demonstrated to the satisfaction of the board adherence to the ethics of the counseling profession, shall have successfully
34 completed the examination prescribed by the board and shall have received:

A. A master's degree in counseling or an allied mental
health field from an accredited institution or program approved by the board. Such schooling shall must include a
minimum core curriculum, as adopted by the board, of at least 45 semester hours; and

B. Two years of experience after obtainment of a master's
degree, to include at least 3,000 hours of supervised clinical experience with a minimum of 100 hours of personal
supervision.

48 Sec. 6. 32 MRSA §13858, sub-§6, as repealed and replaced by PL 1991, c. 263, §4, is amended to read:

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6. Existing counselors. An individual who holds at least a master's degree from a nationally or regionally accredited 2 institution approved by the board or its equivalent, as determined by the board, in counseling, an allied mental health 4 field or a behavioral or social science; has supervised 6 experience as determined necessary by the board through rulemaking or has passed an examination prescribed by the board; and was actively engaged as a counselor for at least 2 of the 8 preceding 5 years prior to January 1, 1991, is deemed to have met 10 all the requirements for licensure. This subsection is repealed June 30, 1995. 12 Sec. 7. 32 MRSA §13859, sub-§1, ¶A, as amended by PL 1989, c. 14 895, §15, is further amended to read: Original and renewal fees for clinical professional 16 Α. counselor, professional counselor, marriage and family 18 counselor or pastoral counselor - \$300 biennially. 20 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved. 22 24 STATEMENT OF FACT 26 Current governing the licensing of counselors law "grandfathers" persons who were practicing counseling prior to 28 January 1, 1991. This bill repeals that provision, effective 30 June 30, 1995. The bill also changes the titles of "licensed clinical 32 professional counselor" and "clinical professional counselor" to "clinical 34 "licensed clinical counselor" and counselor," respectively. 36

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
