	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4	Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §2528, sub-§4, ¶A, as amended by PL 1989, c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is further amended to read:
6	A. The municipal clerk shall make nomination papers available to prospective candidates during the 40 days
8	before the filing deadline. Before issuing nomination papers, the clerk must complete each sheet by writing in the
10	name of the candidate and the title and term of office being sought.

14	(1) Nomination papers must be signed by the following number of voters based on the population of the town according to the last Federal Decennial Census of the
16	United States:
18	(a) Not less than 3 nor more than 10 in towns with a population of 200 or less;
20	with a population of 200 of less,
22	(b) Not less than 10 nor more than 25 in towns with a population of 201 to 500; and
24	(c) Not less than 25 nor more than 100 in towns with a population of more than 500.

28	(2) Each voter who signs a nomination paper shall add the voter's residence with the street and number, if any. The voter may sign enly as many nomination papers
30	for each office as thereare the voter chooses,
