## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 14 MRSA §158-A, sub-§1, ¶A, as amended by PL 1991, c. 795, §1, is further amended to read: 4 6 "Charitable organization" means any nonprofit organization organized or incorporated in this State or having a principal place of business in this State: 8 10 That is exempt from federal income taxation under (1) United States Internal Revenue Code, 501(a), because it is described in Section 501(c)(3), 12 (4), (6) as it pertains to chambers of commerce only, 14 (13) or (14)(A), including all amendments to those paragraphs. An organization is 16 included in this subparagraph if it would be exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) but for its engaging in attempting to influence legislation to the 18 extent that it is disqualified from tax exemption under 20 Section 501(c)(3); or That is: 22 (2) 24 (a) Organized under the Maine Corporation Act for any of the purposes listed in Title 13-B, section 201, subsection 1, paragraph A; 26 Organized under the provisions set forth in 28 Title 13-B, section 201, subsection 2, paragraph 30 Α; 32 (c) Organized under the provisions of Title 13-B, section 201, subsection 3, paragraph D or E; 34 (d) Organized in Maine as a nonprofit corporation 36 before January 1, 1978, for any of the purposes listed in Title 13-B, section 201, subsection 1, 38 paragraph A, and to which the Maine Nonprofit Corporation Act applies; er 40 (e) Organized rural electrification as а 42 cooperative under the provisions of Title 35-A, chapter 37+; or 44 (f) An association of officials or officers of municipalities or other political subdivisions, 46 created to educate its members concerning their official duties and develop statewide standards of 48 conduct for those members in their official

capacities.
