	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 25 MDSA \$2804 E sub \$1 as arounded by DL 1002 a
4	Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2804-E, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1993, c. 744, §7, is further amended to read:
6	1. Required. As a condition to the continued employment of a person as a law enforcement officer with the power to make
8	arrests or the authority to carry a firearm in the course of duty by a municipality, county, the State or other nonfederal
10	employer, that person must successfully complete a minimum number of hours of in-service recertification training as prescribed by
12	the board. <u>The costs for in-service recertification training</u> must be borne by the employer of the law enforcement officer.
14	Sec. 2. 25 MRSA §2804-F, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1989, c.
16	521, \S and 17, is amended to read:
18	1. Required. As a condition to the continued employment of any person as a full-time corrections officer by a municipality,
20	county, the State or other nonfederal employer, that person shall <u>must</u> successfully complete in-service training as prescribed by
22	the board. The costs for in-service training must be borne by the employer of the corrections officer.
