Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 14 MRSA §8102, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1989, c. 104,
4 Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is further amended to read:

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3. Political subdivision. "Political subdivision" means any
7 city, town, plantation, county, administrative entity or
8 instrumentality created pursuant to Title 30-A, chapters 115 and
119, quasi-municipal corporation and special purpose district,
10 including, but not limited to, any water district, sanitary
11 district, sewer district, refuse disposal district, hospital
12 district, school district of any type, any volunteer fire
13 association as defined in Title 30-A, section 3151, and any
14 emergency medical service.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill clarifies by specific reference that any sewer
21 district or refuse disposal district is a special purpose
22 district for purposes of the application of the Maine Tort Claims
23 Act.

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
