Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §621, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 778, is amended to read:

6 1. Certain employers; payment schedule. Every corporation, person or partnership engaged in a manufacturing, mechanical, mining, quarrying, mercantile, restaurant, hotel, summer camp, 8 beauty parlor, amusement, telegraph or telephone business; in any of the building trades; in logging or lumbering operation; upon 10 public works, or in the construction or repair of roads, bridges, sewers, gas, water or electric light works, pipes or 12 lines; every incorporated express company or water company; and every steam railroad company or corporation shall pay weekly each 14 employee engaged in his-or its business the wages earned by the employee to within 8 days of the date of that payment; every 16 county and-eity shall so pay every employee who is engaged in its 18 business the wages or salary earned by him that employee, unless the employee requests in writing to be paid in a different manner. Every-tewn-shall-so-pay-each-employee-in-its-business-if 20 se--required-by-the-employee. Municipalities shall pay their employees at least once every 2 weeks unless the employee agrees 22 to be paid under a less frequent pay schedule. a time fixed for payment shall must be paid thereafter on demand.

This bill establishes a general bi-weekly pay schedule for municipal employees, but also allows municipalities to adopt schedules that are more flexible and less expensive to administer.
