Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §455, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read: 4 Reimbursement for production and issuance costs. 6 5. The Treasurer of State shall transfer annually from the Maine Environmental Trust Fund to the Secretary of State \$10 for each 8 set of environmental registration plates issued er-renewed for 10 the first time. This transfer is to reimburse the Secretary of State for costs associated with production and initial issuance of the plates and is not authorized for renewals. 12 Sec. 2. PL 1993, c. 410, Pt. BBB, §5, first sentence is amended to 14 read: 16 State, in consultation with the The Secretary of 18 Commissioner of Conservation and the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, shall submit a report to the joint 20 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters by January 15, 1996 on the issuance of 22 environmental registration plates during the period April 1, 1994 to December 31, 1995. 24 Sec. 3. BBB, §6 is repealed. 26 28 **STATEMENT OF FACT** 30 This bill changes current law to ensure that, with the exception of the one-time administrative costs associated with 32 production and initial issuance of environmental registration 34 plates, all proceeds are devoted to natural resource protection programs. 36
