An Act to Provide Limited Immunity to Former Employers Who Provide References.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §598 is enacted to read:

\$598. Employment reference immunity

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An employer who, at the request of a former employee, discloses information about that former employee's job performance to a prospective employer of the former employee is presumed to be acting in good faith. Unless clear and convincing evidence of lack of good faith is shown, the employer who discloses the requested employment information is immune from civil liability for the disclosure and its consequences. For the purposes of this section, "clear and convincing evidence of lack of good faith" means evidence that clearly shows the knowing disclosure, with malicious intent, of false or deliberately misleading information or the knowing disclosure of information considered confidential according to applicable federal, state or local statutes, rules or regulations.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill creates immunity from civil liability for an employer providing employment references for a former employee unless the employer knowingly and maliciously provides false or misleading information or discloses confidential information.
