20	COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to S.P. 265, L.D. 705, Bill, "An Act to Discourage Prescription Drug Fraud"
22	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its
24	place the following:
26	'Sec.1. 32 MRSA §13795 is enacted to read:
28	§13795. Photographic proof of identification
30	<ol> <li>Photographic proof of identification. As a precondition to filling any prescription or dispensing any drug, a pharmacist</li> </ol>
32	or person acting at the direction of a pharmacist may demand,
34	inspect and record proof of identification, including valid photographic identification, from any patient presenting a
36	prescription or any person acting on behalf of the patient. Valid photographic identification includes but is not limited to
38	the following:
40	A. A valid Maine motor vehicle operator's license;
42	B. A valid Maine identification card issued under Title 5, section 88-A;
44	C. A valid United States passport;
46	D. A valid passport or motor vehicle operator's license of another state, territory, possession or foreign country only

50	(1) Contains a photograph of the traveler or licensee;

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(2) Is encased in tamper-resistant plastic or 2 otherwise possesses indicia of tamper-resistance; and 4 (3) Identifies the traveler's or licensee's date of birth; or 6 Ε. Other valid, tamper-resistant, photographic identification as provided in rules adopted by the Board of 8 Commissioners of the Profession of Pharmacy pursuant to 10 section 13722, subsection 1, paragraph A and in accordance with Title 5, chapter 375. 12 2. Refusal to fill prescription or dispense drug. A 14 pharmacist or person acting at the direction of a pharmacist may exercise discretion and refuse to fill any prescription or 16 dispense any drug if unsatisfied as to the legitimacy or appropriateness of any prescription presented, the validity of any photographic identification or the identity of any patient 18 presenting a prescription or any person acting on behalf of the 20 patient.' 22 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following: 24 **'FISCAL NOTE** 26 The Board of Commissioners of the Profession of Pharmacy will incur some minor additional costs to adopt certain rules 28 pertaining to requirements for photographic identification. These costs can be absorbed within the board's existing budgeted 30 resources.' 32 STATEMENT OF FACT 34 This amendment replaces the bill. It allows pharmacists to require proof of photographic identification prior to filling 36 prescriptions. It specifies acceptable forms of photographic identification and allows for additional means as adopted by rule 38 of the Board of Commissioners of the Profession of Pharmacy. It authorizes pharmacists to exercise discretion and refuse to fill 40 any prescription or dispense any drug if unsatisfied as to the prescription or the identification or the identity of the patient 42 or the person acting on behalf of the patient. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill. 44

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT
