	Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §5286 is enacted to read:

	1. Fort Knox restoration. A taxpayer who, when filing that
	taxpayer's return, is entitled to a refund under this Part may
	designate that a portion of that refund be paid to the Department
	of Conservation, Bureau of Parks and Recreation, for the
	restoration of Fort Knox. Each individual income tax return form
ļ	must contain a designation in substantially the following form:
	"Contribution to the Restoration of Fort Knox: ( ) \$1, ( ) \$5,
	( ) \$10 or ( ) other \$ ."
	2. Contributions credited to the Department of
	Conservation. The State Tax Assessor shall determine annually
	the total amount contributed pursuant to subsection 1. Prior to
	the beginning of the next year, the State Tax Assessor shall
	deduct the cost of administering the checkoff, but not exceeding
	\$1,000 annually, and report the remainder to the Treasurer of
	State, who shall credit that amount to the Department of
	Conservation, Bureau of Parks and Recreation, for the restoration
	of Fort Knox.
	3. Repeal. This section is repealed January 1, 2000.
	STATEMENT OF FACT
	This bill establishes an income tax checkoff to raise funds
	to restore Fort Knox, an historic site and state park in Prospect, Maine.
