An Act to Make Allocations from the Transportation Safety Fund for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1996 and June 30, 1997.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after 6 the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

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Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the Department of Public Safety and the Department 10 of the Secretary of State will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1995; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 14 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 16 safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §561, sub-§3, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 22 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:

There must be allocated to the Department of 24 в. the Secretary of State for the Bureau of Motor Vehicles no more 26 than \$660,000 <u>\$750,000</u> annually for enforcement of commercial driver license law.

Sec. 2. Allocation of funds. Income to the Transportation 30 Safety Fund for the next 2 fiscal years, from July 1, 1995 to June 30, 1996 and from July 1, 1996 to June 30, 1997, must be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in 32 thefollowing schedule.

Sec. 3. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations under this Act 16 may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Officer, with 18 the approval of the Governor, to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legislature and those reclassifications or range 20 changes that have been approved by the Department of 22 Administrative and Financial Services and submitted for legislative review prior to the effective date of this Act.

Sec. 4. Encumbered balance at year end. At the end of each fiscal year, all encumbered balances may not be carried more than once.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 30 preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.
