10	§7781. Definitions
12	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
14	indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
16	1. Acquisition. "Acquisition" means fee ownership, easement, lease, right-of-way and other less-than-fee interests
18	in land.
20	2. Board. "Board" means the Maine Outdoor Heritage Fund Board.
22	3. Coordinator of the Natural Areas Program. "Coordinator
24	of the Natural Areas Program" means the person appointed by the Commissioner of the Department of Economic and Community
26	Development to be responsible for coordinating the Natural Areas Program.
28	4. Fund. "Fund" means the Maine Outdoor Heritage Fund.
30	5. Matching funds. "Matching funds" means any combination
32	of public and private funds used in conjunction with the Maine Outdoor Heritage Fund for the purpose of this chapter, including,
34	but not limited to, private contributions of cash or securities,

40	6. Natural resources agencies. "Natural resources agencies" means state agencies, bureaus, boards, commissions or other instrumentalities having jurisdiction over the protection

44	7. Public-private partnership. "Public-private
46	<u>partnership" means any partnership between federal agencies, state agencies or individuals or any combination of federal</u>
48	agencies, state agencies or individuals, including corporations and private persons or organizations, where at least 1/3 of the
50	<u>funding is contributed by a nongovernmental organization or individual.</u>

8. Wildlife. "Wildlife" means wild organisms, including vertebrate, invertebrate and plant species.

§7782. Fund established

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There is established the Maine Outdoor Heritage Fund. The 8 fund consists of revenues received pursuant to Title 8, section 387 and any funds received as contributions from private and 10 public sources. The fund, to be accounted within the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, must be held separate and apart 12 from all other money, funds and accounts. Eligible investment earnings credited to the assets of the fund become part of the 14 assets of the fund. Any balance remaining in the fund at the end of any fiscal year must be carried forward to the next fiscal 16 year.

18 §7783. Purpose of fund

20 The fund is for the sole purpose of maintaining, improving and expanding state and local natural resource conservation 22 programs and associated compatible public uses in accordance with the strategic plan provided for by section 7788, subsection 5, 24 paragraph A.

26 §7784. Relation to other funding

The fund supplements sources and levels of funding 28 appropriated and allocated by the Legislature to natural 30 resources agencies. It is the intent of this legislation that a grant received from the fund not be considered a substitute for 32 funds previously appropriated or allocated to a natural resources agency.

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§7785. Fund availability

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The fund must be available to natural resources agencies in accordance with section 7787. Natural resources agencies may 38 contract with nongovernmental organizations and individuals for the purpose of carrying out projects funded by the fund. 40

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	The board must be organized within the Department of Inland
36	Fisheries and Wildlife and shall carry out its duties in
	accordance with this section.
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	1. Members. The board consists of 7 members. The
40	Commissioner of Conservation, the Commissioner of Inland
	Fisheries and Wildlife and the Coordinator of the Natural Areas
42	Program are permanent members and their designees may represent
	them at board meetings. The Governor shall appoint the remaining
44	4 citizen members subject to the review of the joint standing
	committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural
46	resource matters and confirmation by the Senate. One of these
	members must be a representative of a state sportsman's
48	organization, one must be a representative of a state wildlife

26	<u>C. Appointed citizen members receive compensation equal to legislative per diem and travel expenses under Title 5, section 12004-G, subsection 29-B, while engaged in board</u>
28	activities.
30	D. A quorum of the board for the transaction of business is 4 members.
32	E. Board members are governed by the conflict of interest
34	provisions in Title 5, section 18.
36	5. Board duties. The board has the following duties.
38	A. No later than September 1996, the board, in accordance with the rulemaking provisions of the Maine Administrative
40	<u>Procedure Act and in consultation with natural resources agencies, shall adopt a strategic plan for each of the</u>
42	funding categories listed in section 7787. The board may cooperate with other state or federal agencies in developing
44	the plan or carrying out other duties under this chapter. The strategic plan must identify the priority areas for
46	funding for 6 years using the criteria listed in section 7789. The board may amend the strategic plan.

50	<u>B. The board shall review and award annually funding</u> requests for specific projects from natural resources

2	agencies. The board may award grants only to proposals that
2	conform to the strategic plan adopted pursuant to paragraph
^	A. Grant proposals that establish a public-private
4	partnership are encouraged. Grant proposals must include a
~	stated purpose, timeline, potential outcomes, a budget and
6	an explanation of need.
8	C. The board shall submit an annual report to the Governor
	and the joint standing committees of the Legislature having
10	jurisdiction over energy and natural resource matters and
	inland fisheries and wildlife matters. In the annual
12	report, the board shall detail expenditures made from the
	fund and the board's progress in implementing the strategic
14	plan. The first report must be submitted in 1996.
16	D. Responsibility for administration of the board lies with
	the chair. The board shall hire an executive director no
18	later than February 1996. The executive director may hire
	<u>an additional staff person, if the board determines it</u>
20	necessary. The executive director shall direct the daily
	operations of the board. Staff positions may be part-time.
22	The executive director position is unclassified and the
	executive director serves at the pleasure of the board. The
24	<u>board shall prepare and adopt an annual budget to be</u>
	included with the report required under paragraph C. The
26	board may obtain the services of consultants as necessary to
	carry out its duties under this chapter. The board may
28	spend money to cover administrative costs. The board shall
	endeavor to keep the level of administrative expenses as low
30	as practicable and include, in its annual report, discussion

	§7789. Fund distribution criteria for strategic plan and grants
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	In developing the strategic plan provided for by section
38	7788, subsection 5, paragraph A and reviewing and awarding grant
	proposals submitted pursuant to section 7788, subsection 5,
40	paragraph B, the board shall consider whether a project involves:
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42	1. Fisheries and wildlife and habitat conservation. For
	the category of fisheries and wildlife and habitat conservation:
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	A. A species or species group adversely affected due to
46	lack of management or habitat loss;
48	B. A species or species group that is adversely affected
	due to unusual vulnerability to man-made disturbances and
50	requirements for a special or limited habitat type;

36	STATEMENT OF FACT
	This bill creates the Maine Outdoor Heritage Fund, funded by
38	a new wildlife lottery game, to support fisheries and wildlife; acquisition and management of public lands, parks and public
40	access areas; endangered and threatened species conservation projects; and natural resources law enforcement. The bill also
42	establishes the Maine Outdoor Heritage Fund Board to administer

the fund.

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
