Resolve, Authorizing Jacqueline M. Sorenson of Westbrook to Sue the State.

Sec. 1. Authorization to sue the State. Resolved: That, notwithstanding any law to the contrary, Jacqueline M. Sorenson, of Westbrook, or her legal representative, who claims to have suffered damages as a result of the State's failure to prosecute the person who allegedly destroyed her home by fire, is authorized to bring a civil action against the State, but not against individual past or present employees of the State.

This action may be brought in the Cumberland County Superior Court within one year from the date this resolve is approved. Liability and damages, including punitive damages, must be determined according to state law as in litigation between individuals. The action may be heard by a Justice of the Superior Court or by a jury. The Maine Rules of Civil Procedure govern the conduct of the action. The Attorney General shall appear, answer and defend the action.

18 The Treasurer of the State shall pay any judgment, including costs and interest, on final process issued by the Superior Court 20 or, if applicable, the Supreme Judicial Court. Recovery may not exceed \$300,000, including costs and interest.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

26 This resolve authorizes Jacqueline M. Sorenson, of Westbrook, to sue the State for damages resulting from the 28 State's failure to prosecute the person who allegedly destroyed her home by fire.
