Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 2 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 4 safety; now, therefore, be it 6 Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Growth of Tax-exempt Property in Maine's Towns, 8 Cities, Counties and Regions, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further 10 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission 12 consists of 21 members as follows: 14 Two members of the Senate, one from the Joint Standing 1. Committee on Taxation and one from the Joint Standing Committee 16 on State and Local Government, appointed by the President of the 18 Senate; Four members of the House of Representatives, 2 from the 20 2. Joint Standing Committee on Taxation and 2 from the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government, appointed by 22 the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 24 The President of the Maine Municipal Association or a 3. 26 designee; 28 4. Any other issues that are related to tax-exempt property
in Maine's communities that the commission determines appropriate; and be it further

Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall prepare a written report of its findings and submit the report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, within 30 days after the convening of the Second Regular Session of the 117th Legislature; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission shall request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it further

Sec. 7. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for each day's attendance at meetings of the commission. All members are entitled to reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses upon application to the Legislative Council. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall administer the commission's budget; and be it further
