Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2959 is enacted to read: 4 §2959. Helicopter overflight limitations б A state, county or local law enforcement agency, the Maine Drug Enforcement Agency and the Maine National Guard may not use 8 helicopters in their operations except in conformance with a search warrant issued pursuant to the applicable state or federal 10 rules of criminal procedure when there is probable cause to believe that marijuana is being grown on the property to be 12 surveyed. 14 16 STATEMENT OF FACT 18 This bill prohibits the Maine Drug Enforcement Agency, the Maine National Guard and all other law enforcement agencies from 20 using helicopters without a search warrant and probable cause to 22 believe that marijuana is being grown on the property to be surveyed. 24
