An Act to Appropriate Funds for the Churchill Dam and to Provide for the Use of Controlled Releases of Water.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. Use of Churchill Dam as storage reservoir for power generation. The Department of Conservation, in designing and rebuilding the Churchill Dam, shall explore all opportunities to use controlled releases from the dam for downstream power generation by hydroelectric facilities on the St. John River. department shall seek to enter into an agreement or agreements with New Brunswick Power for the use of controlled water releases from the dam. The Commissioner of Conservation shall report to the Legislature by January 1, 1996 on the actions the department has taken under this section and the nature of any that have been negotiated or finalized. commissioner shall also report on the projected yearly revenues to the State that any agreement would produce.

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Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

34 This bill appropriates \$1,400,000 to the Department of Conservation to fund the rebuilding of the Churchill Dam on the 36 Allagash Wilderness Waterway. This bill also requires department to explore all opportunities to use controlled releases from the dam for downstream power generation. 38 Brunswick Power operates several dams on the St. John River below 40 the Churchill Dam and has in prior years shown an interest in the use of Churchill Lake for water storage for release to downstream hydroelectric facilities. This bill requires the Commissioner of 42 Conservation to report to the Legislature by January 1, 1996 on the actions the department has taken to enter into agreements 44 with New Brunswick Power and the potential revenues associated 46 with any of those agreements.
