#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2053, sub-§2-A, as amended by PL 1993, c. 390, §3, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

2-A. Community health or social service facility. "Community health or social service facility" means a community-based facility that provides medical or medically related diagnostic or therapeutic services, mental health or mental retardation services, substance abuse services, family counseling and domestic abuse intervention services, or engages in ancillary activities supporting those services, and is licensed or subject to oversight by the State.

### Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §2053, sub-§4-D is enacted to read:

4-D. Participating community health or social service facility. "Participating community health or social service facility" means a community health or social service facility that is exempt from taxation under section 501 of the United States Internal Revenue Code and that, pursuant to this chapter, undertakes the financing and construction or acquisition of a project or undertakes the refunding or refinancing of existing indebtedness as provided in and committed by this chapter.

Sec. 3. 22 MRSA  $\S2053$ , sub- $\S6$ ,  $\PA$ , as amended by PL 1993, c. 390,  $\S8$ , is further amended to read:

A. In the case of a participating health care facility or a participating community health or social service facility, the acquisition, construction, improvement, reconstruction or equipping of, or construction of an addition or additions to, a structure designed for use as a health care facility, community health or social service facility, congregate housing facility, laboratory, laundry, nurses or interns residence or other multi-unit housing facility for staff, employees, patients or relatives of patients admitted for treatment in the health care facility, community health or office social service facility, doctors building, administration building, research facility, maintenance, storage or utility facility or other structures facilities related to any of the foregoing or required or useful for the operation of the project, or the refinancing of existing indebtedness in connection with any of the including parking and other facilities foregoing, structures essential or convenient for the orderly conduct of the health care facility or community health or social "Project" also includes all real and service facility. personal property, lands, improvements, driveways, roads, roads, rights-of-way, approaches, pedestrian access

utilities, easements and other interests in land, parking lots, machinery and equipment, and all other appurtenances and facilities either on, above or under the ground that are used or usable in connection with the structures mentioned includes this paragraph, and landscaping, preparation, furniture, machinery and equipment and other similar items necessary or convenient for the operation of a particular facility or structure in the manner for which its use is intended, but does not include such items as food, supplies or other items that are customarily considered as a current operating charge. In the case of a hospital, as defined in subsection 4, paragraph B, a community health center or a community mental health facility, "project" include facilities, does not any structures or appurtenances, the use of which is not directly related to the provision of patient care by its members; and
