An Act to Allow Emergency Personnel to Have Permanent Red Lights on Their Private Vehicles.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2054, sub-§2, ¶F, as enacted by PL 1993, c.
4	683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:
б	F. Only vehicles listed in this paragraph, rural mail vehicles as provided in paragraph C, subparagraph (5) and
8	school buses may be equipped with, display or use a red auxiliary or emergency light.
10	(1) Emergency lights used on an ambulance, an
12	emergency medical service vehicle, a fire department vehicle, a fire vehicle or a hazardous material
14	response vehicle must emit a red light or a combination of red and white light.
16	
18	(2) The municipal officers, when approved by the fire chief, may authorize an active member of a municipal or volunteer fire department to use a flashing red signal
20	light not more than 5 inches in diameter that may be permanently mounted on a vehicle. The light may be
22	displayed but may be used only while the member is en route to or at the scene of a fire or other emergency.
24	The light must be mounted as near as practicable above the registration plate on the front of the vehicle ΘF_{\perp}
26	on the dashboard <u>or on the roof</u> . A light mounted on the dashboard must be shielded so that the emitted
28	light does not interfere with the operator's vision.
30	(3) Members of an emergency medical service licensed by Maine Emergency Medical Services may display and use
32	on a vehicle a flashing red signal light of the same proportion, in the same location and under the same
34	conditions as those permitted municipal and volunteer firefighters, when authorized by the chief official of
36	the emergency medical service.

42	This bill allows volunteer fire fighters and emergency personnel to have permanent red lights on their vehicles.
