20	This bill makes several amendments to the statute governing

2.1	Optometrists who desire to use therapeutic pharmaceuticals

	have been in practice for at least one year. Optometrists
28	currently diagnose glaucoma. This bill allows them to treat the
	disease and to prescribe oral as well as topical pharmaceuticals
30	as do other health care professionals.
32	In addition, this bill authorizes the Board of Optometry to clarify the scope of the practice of optometry within the
34	parameters established by the Legislature.

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Finally, the bill clarifies optometric use of lasers.
