An Act to Better Enable Small Businesses to Keep On-line Lottery Machines.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 8 MRSA §412, sub-§1, ¶E, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 732, §1, is amended to read:

E. Insufficiency of the number of tickets sold by the sales agent, except that if a sales agent's total monthly average
ticket sales are below that required by the Liquor and Lottery Commission, the license may not be suspended or
revoked and the agent's on-line lottery machine may not be removed if the agent pays \$50 per month toward the cost of
maintaining the lottery machine's phone line in any month the agent's average sales are below the required average; or

STATEMENT OF FACT

18 This bill gives on-line lottery agents the option of keeping their machines if their average monthly sales are below that set 20 by the State Liquor and Lottery Commission. Instead of the State Liquor and Lottery Commission pulling an agent's machine when an 22 agent's sales are below the required monthly average, the agent may pay the commission \$50 per month toward the costs of 24 maintaining the machine's phone line in any month the agent's sales are below the required average.
