Conservation. Depending on the types of registrations actually sold, the Department of Conservation could receive as much as
\$205,825 in additional annual fees for deposit into the Snowmobile Trail Fund. The amounts can not be determined at this
time.

8 Expanding the sales and use tax exemption for nonresident purchases of snowmobiles will result in a loss of revenue to the 10 General Fund and the Local Government Fund for state-municipal revenue sharing. The amounts of these losses can not be 12 determined at this time.'

## **STATEMENT OF FACT**

This amendment clarifies that snowmobiles purchased in this State by nonresidents are not subject to sales or use taxes. This amendment also strikes the fiscal note and replaces it with a corrected version.
