 who customarily performs the work of installing plumbing and drainage under the employment and direction of a master plumber
 or, not being a master plumber, does plumbing repair work as a regular part-time occupation. The biennial fee for a journeyman
 plumber's license may not exceed \$75.

6. Large equipment natural gas technician. "Large equipment natural gas technician" means a person who performs natural gas technician work on any single piece of gas utilization equipment rated at more than 1,000,000 BTUs. The license must specify the name of the person, firm or corporation to whom the license is issued and in case of a firm or corporation the license must further specify the licensed large equipment natural gas technician in whose name it is issued.
22 pursuant to section 3507. The biennial fee for a large equipment natural gas technician's license may not exceed \$150.

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7. Limited license. "Limited license" means a limited
plumber's license to install and service plumbing work related to
a specific type of plumbing equipment or to specific plumbing
installations and is granted to any person who has passed a
satisfactory examination before the board. It must specify the
name of the person who is limited to engage in the occupation of
installing and servicing the plumbing work related to the type of
equipment or to specific plumbing installations only as
authorized by the license. The biennial fee for a limited
license may not exceed \$75.

36 8. Master plumber. "Master plumber" means a person, firm or corporation, qualified under this chapter, engaging in, or about 38 to engage in, the business of installing plumbing or plumbing systems. The license must specify the name of the person, firm 40 or corporation to whom the license is issued and in the case of a firm or corporation the license must further specify the licensed 42 master plumber in whose name it is issued, pursuant to the requirements of section 3507. The biennial fee for a master 44 plumber's license may not exceed \$150.

46	9. Natural gas technician work. "Natural gas technician
	work" means any work related to the installation, alteration,
48	venting, servicing and replacement of a piping system or related
	equipment, including required electrical connection to gas
50	equipment and gas-related water hookup, beyond the fuel

supplier-owned point through which is conveyed natural gas of any kind for purposes, including, but not limited to, space heating, water heating, cooking, air conditioning or vehicle fuel stations.

10. Propane gas installer. "Propane gas installer" means a
 person carrying a certification of qualification issued by the
 person's employer pursuant to the training requirements and
 qualifications required by National Fire Protection Association
 Code Number 58, subsection 1-6 "Qualification of Personnel," 1992
 edition.

12 11. Small equipment natural gas technician. "Small equipment natural gas technician" means a person who performs 14 natural gas technician work on any single piece of gas utilization equipment rated up to and including 1,000,000 BTUs. The license must specify the name of the person, firm or 16 corporation to whom the license is issued and in the case of a firm or corporation the license must further specify the licensed 18 small equipment natural gas technician in whose name it is issued, pursuant to section 3507. The biennial fee for a small 20 equipment natural gas technician's license may not exceed \$75.

12. Trainee natural gas technician. "Trainee natural gas technician" means a person who is engaged in assisting in natural gas technician work under the direct supervision of a small equipment or large equipment natural gas technician, whether for the purpose of learning the trade or otherwise. Work performed by the trainee may not exceed the restrictions of the license held by the supervising natural gas technician. The biennial fee for a trainee natural gas technician's license may not exceed \$40.

32 13. Trainee plumber. "Trainee plumber" means a person who is engaged in assisting in making plumbing installations under 34 the direct supervision of a journeyman plumber or master plumber, whether for the purpose of learning the trade or otherwise. The 36 biennial fee for a trainee plumber license may not exceed \$40.

 22 municipally licensed nor-shall-any. <u>A</u> municipality <u>may not</u> issue a permit for any plumbing installation unless satisfied that the
 24 person, firm or corporation applying for the permit complies with this chapter.

Following the installation and testing of natural gas 38 utilization equipment, the installer shall attach a permanent tag 40 in a conspicuous place on or near the equipment, showing the name and license number of the installer and the date and scope of work as defined in section 3301-A, subsection 9. Installers 42 include natural gas technicians and persons exempted from 44 licenses under section 3302. 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#### §3402. Employees

1. Appointment. The commissioner, with the advice and 34 consent of the board, may appoint, subject to the Civil Service Law, such employees as may be necessary to carry out this chapter. All employees must be located within the department and 36 under the administrative and supervisory direction of the commissioner. 38

2. Powers; inspections; right of entry. State plumbing 40 inspectors and state gas inspectors appointed under this section 42 have powers similar to those that sheriffs have in their respective counties relating to enforcement of this chapter and 44 rules adopted under this chapter. These powers are limited to the power to issue citations, to serve summonses, to conduct 46 investigations and to order corrections of violations by licensees in accordance with this chapter. A person may serve 48 simultaneously as a plumbing inspector and a gas inspector. State plumbing or state gas inspectors may enter all buildings 50 and premises during usual business hours in the performance of

their duties. They may enter any building only with the permission of the owner, occupant or person having control of the building or pursuant to a court order.

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3. Plumbing inspectors; notice to vacate. If a state 6 plumbing inspector finds a plumbing installation in a building or structure that does not comply with the adopted state plumbing 8 code, that inspector shall, with the consent of the local plumbing inspector, order that the installation be removed or 10 remedied, and that order must be complied with immediately by the owner or occupant of the premises or building or by the installer 12 of the plumbing in violation. If a state plumbing inspector finds a plumbing installation in a building or structure that 14 creates a danger to other property or to the public, the inspector may prohibit the use of the building or structure by serving a written order upon the owner and the occupant, if any, 16 to vacate within a reasonable period of time to be stated in the 18 order.

20 4. Gas inspectors; notice to vacate. If a state gas inspector finds a natural gas installation, as described in this 22 chapter, in a building or structure that does not comply with the applicable gas and electrical codes of the National Fire 24 Protection Association or any other appropriate code as determined by the board and does not utilize residential gas 26 equipment approved by a board-accepted testing agency, or does not utilize commercial or industrial equipment approved by a 28 board-accepted testing agency or is not installed in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, that inspector shall 30 order that the installation be removed or remedied and that order must be complied with immediately by the owner or occupant of the 32 premises or building or by the installer of the natural gas equipment in violation. If a state gas inspector finds any 34 natural gas installation in a building or structure that creates a danger to other property or to the public, the inspector may 36 prohibit the use of the building or structure by serving a written order upon the owner and the occupant, if any, to vacate 38 within a reasonable period of time to be stated in the order.

40 5. Appeal. Any person ordered by a state plumbing inspector or a state gas inspector to correct a plumbing or gas installation deficiency or to vacate a building or structure may 42 appeal the order to the board by filing a written notice of 44 appeal with that board within 48 hours of receipt of the order. The board shall review that appeal and issue its written decision within 10 days after receipt of the notice of appeal. If the 46 board upholds the inspector's order, it shall prescribe the time 48 period for the requisite correction specified in its written decision or the time within which that person must vacate the 50 building or structure. The person ordered by the board to correct a plumbing or gas installation deficiency or to vacate a
 building or structure must comply with that order unless that
 person appeals the order to the Superior Court pursuant to the
 Maine Rules of Civil Procedure, Rule 80B by filing a petition for
 review within 48 hours of receipt of the order. The order by the
 board may not be stayed unless by order of the Superior Court for
 good cause.

- 6. Compliance. Upon the failure of any person to carry out
   the final order, the board may petition the Superior Court for
   the county in which the premises or building is located for an
   injunction to enforce that order. If the court determines upon
   hearing the petition that a lawful final order was issued, it
   shall order compliance.

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The board shall meet at least once a year to conduct its business and to elect a ehairman chair and a secretary. Additional meetings shall <u>must</u> be held as necessary to conduct the business of the board, and may be convened at the call of the ehairman chair or a majority of the board members. Two Four members of the board shall constitute a quorum for all purposes. The board shall keep such records and minutes as-are necessary to the ordinary dispatch of its function.

5. Orders. The board and any person designated by the board may issue an order to cease and desist the installation or 34 substantial alteration of plumbing or natural gas systems by any 36 person required to be licensed by the board and who is not licensed by the board. The order is immediately effective and 38 shall must be accompanied by written notice of opportunity and procedure for appeal. The person ordered to cease and desist may 40 appeal the order and may request a hearing. The appeal and request for hearing shall must be filed with the board within 48 42 hours of the order. A hearing shall must be granted by the board within 5 days of receipt of the request. The board shall issue 44 its written decision of its review within 15 days of receipt of the request for appeal or hearing.

Any person ordered by the board to cease and desist may appeal to the Superior Court in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter VII, by filing a 50 petition for review within 48 hours of receipt of the order. The court shall issue a written decision within 20 days after receipt
of the petition for review. The decision of the Superior Court on an appeal, as provided, is final. The decision of the board or
order of the board shall is also be final and subject to no further appeal upon failure to file a timely written appeal as
provided.

The board shall investigate or cause to be investigated all complaints made to it and all cases of noncompliance with or violation of this chapter. The board may suspend or revoke a license pursuant to Title 5, section 10004. The board may refuse to issue or renew a license or the Administrative Court may suspend, revoke or refuse to renew the license of any licensed plumber or natural gas technician for any of the following 20 reasons:

22 1. Fraud or deceit. The practice of any fraud or deceit in obtaining a license;

Negligence or misconduct. Any gross negligence,
 incompetency or misconduct in the performance of the work of making plumbing or natural gas installations;

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3. Violation of law. Any violation of this chapter or any 30 rule adopted by the board; or

 4. Conviction of crime. Subject to the limitations of Title 5, chapter 341, conviction of a crime which that involves
 dishonesty or false statement or which that relates directly to the practice of plumbing or natural gas installation, or
 conviction of any crime for which incarceration for one year or more may be imposed.

The board, for reasons it may deem <u>determine</u> sufficient, may 40 reissue a license to any person whose license has been revoked, providing 2 <u>4</u> or more members of the board vote in favor of the 42 reissuance.
