An Act to Regulate the Use of Gill Nets in the Coastal Waters of the State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6553-B, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 681, §1, is amended to read:

§6553-B. Fixed gill nets; limited prohibition

A person may not use a gill net that is fixed or anchored to the bottom or shore in any-tidal the coastal waters of the Kennebee-River--or-the-Androscoggin--River--or-their--tidal tributaries,--including-those-tidal-waters-of-Phippsburg,--West Bath,-Bath,-Bowdoinham,-Topsham,-Dresden,-Woolwich,--Arrowsic-and Georgetown-that-are-connected to the Kennebec-River-upstream-from Fort--Popham this State, unless that fixed gill net is tended continuously, hauled back and emptied at least once every 2 hours and is affixed with a floating marker that includes the name and address of the owner of the net. Notwithstanding section 6204, a violation of this section is a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not more than \$500 may be adjudged.

This section is repealed July-1,-1996 January 1, 2000.

Sec. 2. Commissioner of Marine Resources to monitor fish populations. The Commissioner of Marine Resources shall monitor continuously fish populations, including, but not limited to, striped bass, cod, haddock and bluefish, in the coastal waters of this State for the purpose of reporting the status of these fish populations to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources no later than January 1, 1999 so that the committee may use this information in deciding whether to continue the limited prohibition on the use of gill nets, pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 6553-B, after January 1, 2000.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits the use of a fixed gill net in the coastal waters of this State unless that net is tended continuously. The bill repeals this prohibition on January 1, 2000. The bill directs the Commissioner of Marine Resources to monitor fish populations and report the status of these populations to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources to help that committee in deciding whether to continue the prohibition in this bill after January 1, 2000.
